Looking for a book? Call numbers can be confusing!

Here are a few tips:

GF 1006 R45 N367 1954

- GF The first letters are taken at face value.

 GF comes before GR
- The **first number** in a call number is the **only whole number**, So 1006 really is One-thousand-and-six, not 1, 0, 0, 6.
- N367

 Any Additional Letters and Numbers are taken as individual values. Read as R, 4, 5, N, 3, 6, 7.
 This means R45 comes before R5 because 4 is smaller than 5, (even though 45 is larger than 5!)
 And N367 comes before N4, since 3 is smaller than 4.
- However, when it looks like a year at the end, it is a **publication date**, in this case, 1954. Not all call numbers contain the year of publication.

GF 21 S333 2010

- Read straightforwardly as **GF**(comes after GE)

 This is one whole number, read as 21, not 2, 1
 - These are <u>individual values</u>, read as **S**, **3**, **3**, **3**, *not S333*
 - 2010 The book was published in 2010
